ARTIST STATEMENT

A quiet commentary of living and painting from home, my practice has documented scenes from everyday life, looking to capture moments in time in the people who surround me and depicting their emotions in scenes during the realities of lockdown with all the boredom and frustration that it has brought.

I aim to create connections between the viewer and painted figure by encompassing the figure as the centre of the work, approaching this through photography in which I seek, stage and capture compositions based on instinctive decisions and chance, which are then progressively structured and nuanced through digital editing, collage and painterly decisions. I carefully consider lighting, facial expression and colour to create a heightened sense of reality, whilst using windows, mirrors and objects to amplify the psychological condition of the sitter and play upon a sense of connection. This is furthered through the eyes, which are painted to a life-size scale, staring back at you- the viewer- and the smaller details such as branded clothing. Ambience and tension is constructed through layers of oil paints and liquin, in which some areas are left unfinished, underpainting visible, to contrast against those of more detail, creating a work that focuses on the figure.

I have extended my practice into graphite drawings of hands, looking at hand interactions throughout the pandemic, in which an immediate intimacy is the concept behind this suite of drawings. A juxtaposition is created between the drawings and the paintings, as I stand back from the intensity of the oil works to a quieter description of fleeting, unplanned moments.




