


Unlearning “can be thought of as a conscious effort to identify where there should be a “hole,” or where our experience and knowledge are lacking” (Wilson, 2021).

-  10% Biodiversity




Ratio not indigenous people/ biodiversity



Indigenous peoples are defending their territories.

About 45% of the intact forests in Brazil are in Indigenous territories.

Attacks towards these territories are intensifying and new laws are undermining the renew of the concessions of these territories to the communities.

It's proved that, on average, forests in these territories sink almost twice as much as non-indigenous managed areas.

The notch of the problem is human rights abuse and land permises.


Donating to conservation organizations will not help in this case, supporting indigenous rights' campaigns will do more.

International cooperation works.

In 2021 Greenpeace published a report which showed that international pressure mixed with on-site indigenous resistance proved effective in slowing down the deforestation rate on land already conceded to the palm oil industry in West Papua.

Saving the forest that is still standing would save 71.2 million tonnes of carbon from being released in the atmosphere, the equivalent of half the carbon emission of the aviation industry in the year 2018.



Over 40% of the world reserves of Lithium, one of the essential material to power the solar and wind revolution, is found in Chile.




- 10% Atacama Desert





